Marshall County

Marshall County fce has been active for many years, with the number of clubs varying with the times. At present, there are 3 active clubs with several mailbox members, for a total of 60 members. Each club meets monthly and we also meet 4 times a year as a county group. At 3 of these county meetings, members are asked to participate in service projects.
