

Health Screening & Head Lice Policy

Health Screening

The physical condition of each child will be screened by a licensed medical provider, an RN, or an adult following specific written instructions of a licensed physician at the designated departure site on the day of departure. The screening is meant to check for any observable evidence of illness, injury, or communicable disease, to verify and update health history information to identify any medication, changes in health status or special needs that may require further follow-up and to collect any medications to be dispensed during the stay at camp.

Head Lice

The health screening will include a check for head lice. Because of the contagious nature of head lice, children who have head lice will not be able to participate at 4-H Camp until they have received treatment and have a written statement from a physician stating that they are free of any lice or nits.

If your child is found to have lice or nits on the departure day, you have the following options:

- You may treat your child and provide a statement from a medical professional that he/she is lice and nit free and bring them to camp or
- Receive a full refund
