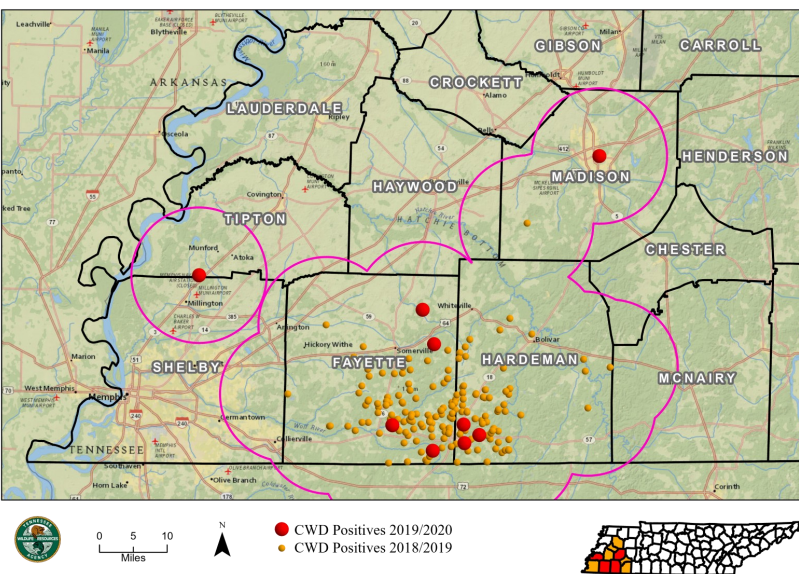

Chronic Wasting Disease Update - Deer Population

From Dr. Daniel Grove, UT Extension Wildlife Veterinarian:

“A clinical 3.5 year old doe from Madison County was found to be CWD positive in late September. This animal was reported to TWRA by the public and TWRA regional staff coordinated removal and sampling of the animal. The 10 mile management buffer around the location of the animal extended into Crockett and Gibson Counties which by rule automatically makes these counties high risk counties for CWD and subject to deer carcass movement restrictions and wildlife feeding restrictions. The hunting regulations that correspond to deer hunting in Unit CWD do not automatically apply. Hunting regulation changes require a new deer hunting proclamation from TN Fish and Wildlife Commission. For now there will be no hunting regulation changes in Crockett and Gibson Counties.

I anticipate that there will be additional high risk counties added sampling continues through archery, muzzleloader and gun season this fall and I will continue to update you as things progress.”
