- (f). \_\_\_\_\_ Department that assists veterans and their families.
- (g). \_\_\_\_\_ Department that helps improve farm income, helps to curb hunger and malnutrition, and helps landowners protect the soil.
- (h). \_\_\_\_\_ Department that serves as a financial agent for the U.S. government and makes coins and bills.
- (i). \_\_\_\_\_ Department that helps Americans who need and want to work.
- (j). \_\_\_\_\_ Department responsible for providing military forces to protect our country.
