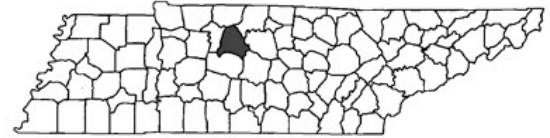

### SALARY

Commensurate with training and experience. This is a grant funded position funded by the Tennessee Nutrition and Consumer Education Program (TNCEP). Continued employment is contingent upon project progress, performance, and funding.

### RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Plan, execute, and evaluate Extension programs related to low-income nutrition education that are diverse, impactful, and engage clients throughout the county
- Provide leadership for Extension programs that meet the needs of all eligible clientele regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion or veteran status.
- The Agent is responsible to the Davidson County Extension Director and will work closely with the Regional Program Leader and TNCEP Project Director.
- Recruit, train, and support volunteer leaders to support low-income nutrition education Extension programs within the county.
- Develop and maintain expertise to Family and Consumer Sciences subjects especially related to nutrition education.
- Cooperate with the staff in promoting the total Extension program.
- Provide accurate and timely reporting of program accomplishments & impacts into the UT Extension reporting system.
- Maintain an image of a professional educator through proper attitude, appropriate dress, suitable conduct, and strong communication skills that will reflect favorably on the University of Tennessee.
- Develop and maintain community partnerships and a county coalition to show external collaborative work for low-income nutrition education efforts at the environmental, systems and policy levels
- Develop a network of relationships with key stakeholders, organizations, and Extension employees pertinent to Extension programs.
- Assist with county budgetary and administrative functions related to the nutrition program area.
- Utilize all areas of mass media as an educational tool for dissemination of Family and Consumer Sciences programs.
- Assume other duties as assigned.
